# "Classical Conversations (CC)"

One of the more common homeschool formats, Classical Conversations uses a traditional approach to education that doesn't have to overwhelm you. Listen as Tara breaks down the ins and outs of CC and why it works for her family.

### Tara's Takeaways:

### What is classical, Christian education?

A classical education incorporates the three stages of learning, known as the trivium. The first stage of the trivium is the grammar stage, which encompasses learning parts, vocabulary, and memorization. The second stage is the dialectic stage, in which a learner takes the information they have collected and makes deeper connections, wrestling with and debating what they know. The final stage, the rhetoric stage, is when a learner is able to communicate and teach what they know, persuading others toward truth, goodness, and beauty. A classical, Christian education does not just add Bible study to an existing curriculum. Classical, Christian education affirms that God is at the center of all we learn and know, and all subjects are integrated and reflect Him as our Creator.

### What is Classical Conversations?


Classical Conversations is a PK4-12 program that encompasses all stages of the trivium with a biblical worldview. The Foundations program (PK4-6th grade) introduces students to the components of history, science, Latin, geography, and more with facts, vocabulary, and memorization. The Essentials program (4th-6th grade) is a rigorous English and writing curriculum that bridges Foundations to Challenge and gives students the opportunity to practice their dialectic skills. The Challenge program (7th grade-12th grade) sees the students' transition from dialectic learners to rhetorical thinkers as they solve problems, write original papers and speeches, participate in debates, and lead class discussions and conversations, culminating with a senior thesis in Challenge IV. Communities meet once a week where tutors model teaching the information at home (Foundations and Essentials), or students come to have Socratic discussion about the work they have completed (Challenge). Community provides accountability, fellowship, and a push to excellence. At CC, parents are the teacher - tutors are there to support and equip parents as they educate their own children.

## How has CC worked for our family?

My oldest has been in CC since she was in kindergarten. We followed the model of focusing on memorization and added on a math and language arts curriculum (which CC recommends). She was interested in researching ancient empires and events on a world timeline as young as 7. When she moved into Essentials, she became extremely efficient in English grammar (due to the memorization work she did in Foundations) and a fantastic writer. Now, as she is beginning her 9th grade year and going into Challenge 1, we have seen her transition into the rhetorical student - one who has been able to make connections and wrestle with ideas and now she can persuade others to truth through her speaking and writing. She does not shy away from big ideas or hard topics and can discuss with maturity and in a reasonable fashion. Her character has also been shaped by her first two years of Challenge - she has become responsible for her own studies and applied personal discipline to complete the rigorous coursework. We have seen the fruit of "trusting the model" of classical education in her life. My youngest has special needs, and we were told at one time she would not mentally progress past the age of 6. CC has been a tremendous blessing for her in that so much of it is memory based, and she thrives on memory work, songs, and repetition. Last year when she identified European countries correctly on a map, I cried because I wasn't sure she'd ever be able to do that. CC has been the perfect fit for both my girls: it has propelled my oldest to excellence and it has given my youngest the opportunity to do things doctors and specialists said she'd never be able to do. We thank God for CC and give Him glory for the work in both girls' lives through this program.






